It was with great sorrow that we lost one of our all age players, Peter Gorman, in a drowning accident. The Gorman family were greatly respected within the club and Peter's loss was marked at the beginning of the 1978 season with a minute silence at the beginning of the All Age Matches.

It was 16th July 1977 – the team was our Raahague Cup 3rd Division Squad. Before the commencement of the first match, the referee advised both teams that if there was any trouble with the spectators, then he would immediately send off the first player he saw from the offended side.
(I don't think that was in the Rule Book)

As there were no linesmen available on the day the two clubs had to supply them. Shortly after kick off the referee was advised, by the linesman, that there were a number of spectators behind the goals and ask the referee if they could be moved. The linesman was told by the referee to shut up.
(I don't think this was in the referee's handbook either)

All Saints' Soccer - A Brief History

One member recalls All Saints' involvement in soccer in the 'thirties', and we have a record of an All Age premier team in 1946. However, the Club as most of us know it was revived in 1960 by the McKenzies : Graham formed a team from the All Saints' Boys' Club which he entered in Under 12s; he was ably assisted & enthusiastically encouraged by his Dad, the late Gordon (" MAC ") With many out of their age group the 12s had a most distressing welcome to soccer (0/10, 0/12 ...) but thankfully, were not deterred - most stayed on to see All Saints' more than holding their own - winning premiership - fielding 4, 8, 10, even 17 teams. One example of early growth was the 1965 acquisition of rope to keep supporters off the field. Oatley Oval was the focal point and All Saints' soccer, The Sport, on Saturday afternoons. Perhaps the most significant event in the early years was "MAC" persuading brother-in-law " JC " to join us. As most will recall, All Age teams and much of our other activities were built around JC, his influence on our progress is legendary.

Of course, most of the credit for our growth and success belongs to the huge band of supporters who came forward from the parents and players, those prepared to accept a share in the work and responsibility of office bearers committees, managers, coaches etc...we could not survive without them. It's pleasing to recall many such staunch workers who put in so much over the years, coaching and managing our many teams, working 'bee-ers' looking after the fields, social organisers, 'behind-the-scenes' workers so often unnoticed; particularly, the help of Rector Barry Bevis, his predecessors & their Councils.

Overleaf is detailed a few statistics of our history, a fuller report may not be appropriate, to fairly report on individuals, player or official, would be impossible - too many must be missed. Perhaps a fitting tribute to those who made this occasion possible will be the success of this function; with a Toast to the many players and families who stuck with us, ensuring continuity, growth and progress through their loyal membership -

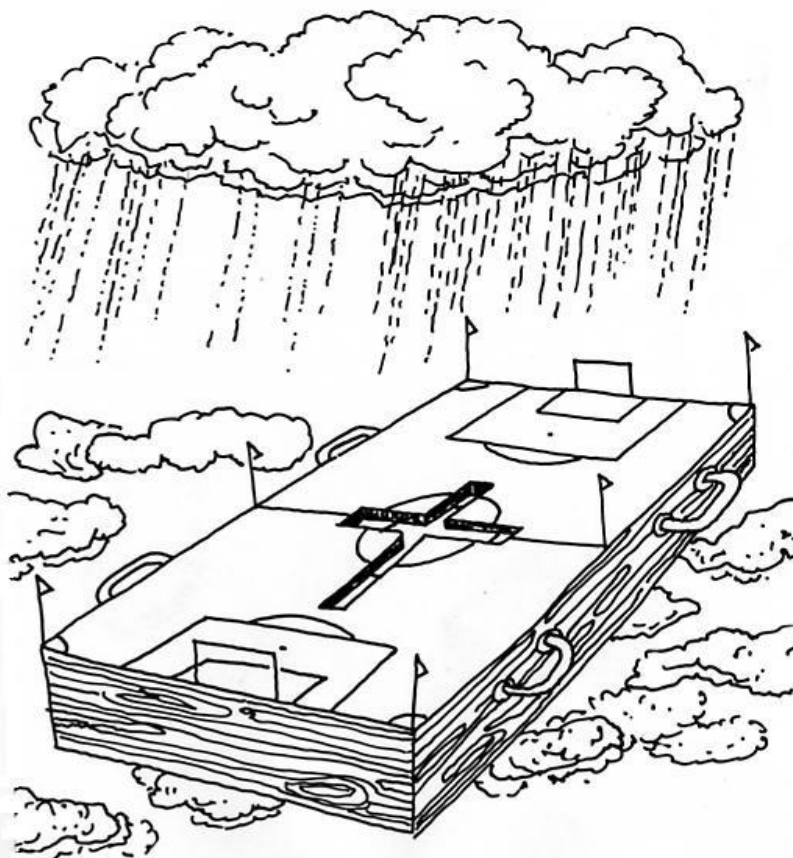
